



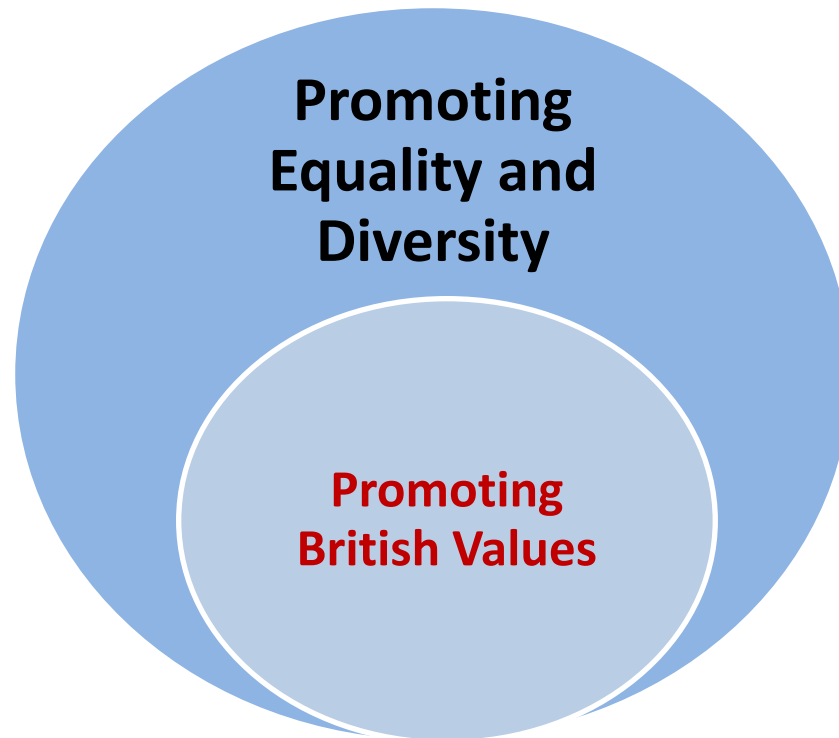

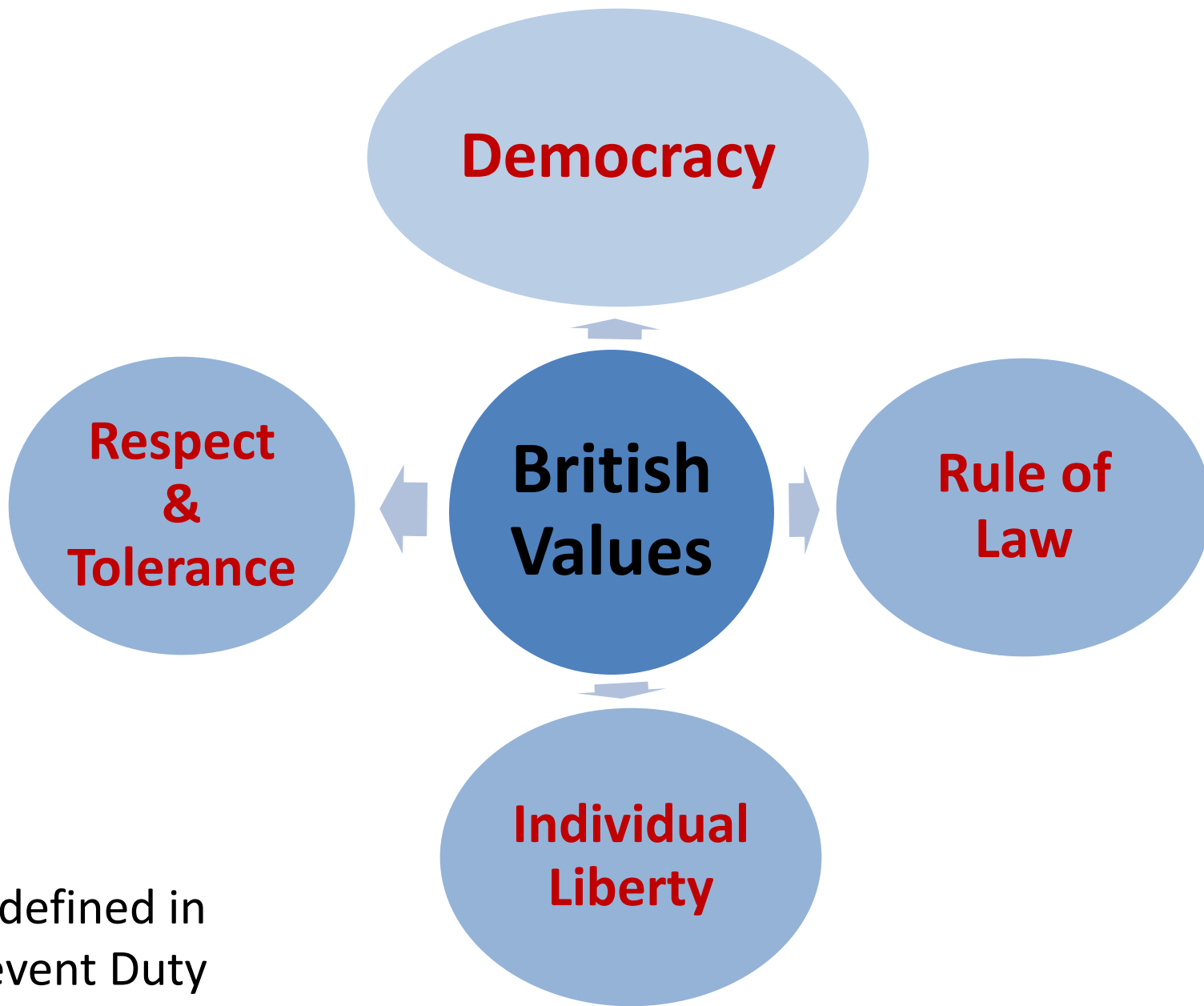
Context

British Values – Democracy
